<b>HB 1914</b> Del. Ward (D-92)	<b>HPV vaccination:</b> Adds HPV vaccine to Board of Health's list of required immunizations for attendance at public or private schools. Parents can opt out.	Referred to Health, Welfare, and Institutions Committee. 1.23.07: Incorporated into HB 2035.
<b>HB 2035</b> Del. Hamilton (R-93)	<b>HPV vaccination:</b> Adds HPV vaccine to Board of Health's list of required immunizations for attendance at public or private schools. Parents can opt-out.	Referred to Health, Welfare, and Institutions Committee. (HB 1914 rolled into HB 2035). 1.23.07: Reported out of committee 20-2. <b>HB 2221</b> Del. Amundson (D-44)	<b>Birth Control Protection Act:</b> Codifies the definition of birth control using the FDA definition. Also prevents birth control from being regulated by Virginia's abortion laws (mandatory 24 hour delay, state-scripted counseling, refusal protection, and parental consent).	<u>Referred to Health, Welfare, and Institutions Committee.</u> <u>1.29.07: Failed to report out of subcommittee 4N – 3Y.</u>
<b>HB 2842</b> Del. Hall (D-69)	<b>Patient Protection Act:</b> Ensures that women will be able to get birth control without discrimination or delay by requiring pharmacies to sell and dispense drugs and devices regardless of any owners' or employees' religious or other personal beliefs.	<u>Referred to Health, Welfare, and Institutions Committee.</u> <u>1.23.07: Stricken from docket at request of patron.</u>
<b>HB 2877</b> Del. McEachin (D-74)	<b>HPV vaccination insurance coverage:</b> Requires health insurance to provide coverage for HPV vaccinations.	Referred to Committee on Commerce and Labor. 1.23.07: House: Tabled in Commerce and Labor. Letter requested for study by Mandated Benefits Commission.

<p><b>SB 1230</b> Sen. Howell (D-32)</p>	<p><b>HPV vaccination:</b> Adds HPV vaccine to Board of Health's list of required immunizations for attendance at public or private schools. Parents can opt out.</p>	<p>Referred to Senate Education and Health Committee. 1.25.07: Reported from Senate Ed &amp; Health 14Y 0-N. <p><b>HB 164</b> Del. Lingamfelter (R-31)</p>	<p><b>FLE Bias:</b> Adds biased and inaccurate information about sexuality to Virginia's Family Life Education guidelines, including abstinence as the norm, the psychological consequences of adolescent sex, and unmarried sex as an illegal act.</p>	<p>Carried over from 2006. 12/11/06: <u>Left in Senate Education &amp; Health Committee (defeated).</u></p>
<p><b>HB 1199</b> Del. R. Marshall (R-13)</p>	<p><b>Birth Control Crime:</b> Creates a Class 6 felony for prescribing oral contraceptives for a minor without parental consent if an interaction occurs with another prescription medication.</p>	<p>Carried over from 2006. 12.8.06: <u>Left in Health, Welfare &amp; Institutions Committee (defeated).</u></p>
<p><b>HB 1883</b> Del. Marshall (R-13)</p>	<p><b>TRAP:</b> Requires any medical facility providing 25 or more abortions per year to comply with the regulatory requirements of an ambulatory surgery center.</p>	<p>Referred to Health, Welfare, and Institutions Committee. 1.18.07: <u>reported out of committee, 14 - 8 (after a tie vote to table it, 8 - 8).</u> 1.23.07: <u>Passed by the full House 60Y- 35N. 02/01/07 Senate: PBI'd in Education and Health (8-Y 7-N)</u></p>
<p><b>HB 2124</b> Del. Marshall (R-13)</p>	<p><b>Abortion Ban:</b> If and when <i>Roe v. Wade</i> is overturned by the US Supreme Court, the Virginia law of June 30, 1970 will be reinstated, criminalizing abortion.</p>	<p>Referred to Courts of Justice Committee. 02/06/07House: <u>Left in Courts of Justice</u></p>
<p><b>HB 2301</b> Del. Cole (R-88)</p>	<p><b>Biased Counseling and Double Ultrasound Requirement:</b> Requires women seeking an abortion to have additional "counseling" with a doctor who is <i>not</i> her provider prior to the procedure, including obtaining an extra ultrasound. The measure increases the cost of services, requires a delay, and increases difficulty in accessing abortion services.</p>	<p>Referred to Courts of Justice. 02/06/07House: <u>Left in Courts of Justice</u></p>

<p><b>HB 2648</b> Del. Chris Jones (R-76)</p>	<p><b>Felony for abortion:</b> Broadly written bill that could call into question legal abortion. Creates a Class 4 felony (2 - 10 years, \$100,000 fine) for producing an abortion. Also includes penalty for producing a miscarriage.</p>	<p>Referred to Courts of Justice Committee. 1.22.07: Reported out of committee 19-0. Referred to Appropriations. 02/02/07: Reported from Appropriations (17-Y 6-N). 02/06/07 House: Passed the House (72-Y 25-N). Senate: Referred to Committee on Education and Health. 2.15.07: Failed to Report (defeated) in Senate Education and Health (7-Y 8-N).</p>
<p><b>HB 2797</b> Del. Marshall (R-13)</p>	<p><b>Personhood from the moment of fertilization:</b> Grants the constitutional right to the enjoyment of life to “each born and preborn human being.” Challenges <i>Roe v. Wade</i> and some forms of legal FDA-approved birth control.</p>	<p>Referred to Privileges and Elections Committee. 02/02/07 Reported from Privileges and Elections (12-Y 7-N). House: VOTE: ENGROSSMENT REFUSED (defeated) (43-Y 53-N).</p>
<p><b>HB 2808</b> Del. Byron (R-22)</p>	<p><b>Biased Counseling and Ultrasound Requirement:</b> Requires that every pregnant female be offered an ultrasound image of her “unborn child” before receiving an abortion.</p>	<p>Referred to Courts of Justice Committee. 02/02/07 Reported from Courts of Justice with substitute (13-Y 8-N). 02/06/07 House: Passed the House (60-Y 38-N). 2/7/07: Senate: Referred to Committee on Education and Health. 2.15.07: Failed to Report (defeated) by Senate Education and Health (6-Y 9-N).</p>
